LEADERSHIP UPDATE

We have had a fabulous week at Cardinal Wiseman during which we have welcomed our new Year 7 parents and pupils; over three hundred staff and Year 4 pupils from our feeder primary schools and celebrated success in our inter house netball competition. Some of our staff, who represent the school as part of our Catholic Life team, have also been active in visiting other schools to help us to share best practice in spiritual life and reflection of students. In our Collective Worship this week we have been focusing upon today's Gospel which reminds us that Jesus called each of us to follow him and that he did not come to, *"call the upright, but sinners."*

Gospel, *Matthew 9:9-13*

As Jesus was walking on from there he saw a man named Matthew sitting at the tax office, and he said to him, 'Follow me.' And he got up and followed him. Now while he was at table in the house it happened that a number of tax collectors and sinners came to sit at the table with Jesus and his disciples.

When the Pharisees saw this, they said to his disciples, 'Why does your master eat with tax collectors and sinners?' When he heard this he replied, 'It is not the healthy who need the doctor, but the sick. Go and learn the meaning of the words: Mercy is what pleases me, not sacrifice. And indeed I came to call not the upright, but sinners.'

LEADERSHIP UPDATE continued

Another very successful week for our community in terms of improving behaviour. Initial figures show a reduction in behaviour incidents of over 51% across the school. This comparison has been made between the first week of our 100% compliance and the week before it was introduced. Year 9 behaviour has shown the most improvement with almost 65% reduction. Well done Year 9!

The impact of this on the learning environment is immense. Students and parents at last night's Year 8 Parents' Evening were extremely positive about lessons and the calm and orderly atmosphere in all areas of our community.

Many thanks once again to you as parents and carers for supporting us in what we are doing. Please be assured this is not a gimmick, we are dedicated to providing your child with the educational experience they are entitled to.

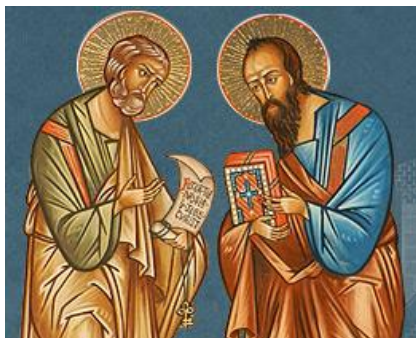
The Feast of St Peter and St Paul

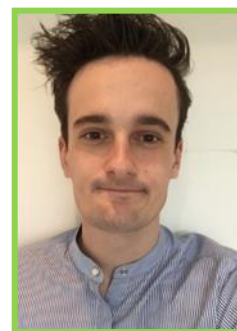


Mr Witek
