KEY STAGE 4 RELIGIOUS STUDIES (YEAR 9)

Students follow the WJEC Religious Studies Option B specification and begin studying for the first of two papers to be taken in Year 11. They look at ethical and philosophical questions from a

Catholic perspective and compare and contrast these with the views of other Christian denominations and world religions.

Students receive 4 x 75 minute lessons per fortnight.

Themes covered include:

- Issues of love, marriage and divorce.
- Issues of equality and justice.
- Issues about God, life and death.

This is subject to change due to GCSE reforms which at the time of writing have not been finalised.

KEY STAGE 4 RELIGIOUS STUDIES (YEAR 10)

Students continue to study WJEC Religious Studies Option B Paper 1 and begin work on Paper 2. They look at ethical and philosophical questions from a Catholic perspective and compare and contrast these with the views of other Christian denominations and world religions.

Students receive 4 x 75 minute lessons per fortnight.

Themes covered include:

- Environmental issues.
- Issues of peace, forgiveness and conflict.
- Issues of medical ethics.

KEY STAGE 4 RELIGIOUS STUDIES (YEAR 11)

Students continue to study WJEC Religious Studies Option B paper 1 and begin work on paper 2. They look at ethical and philosophical questions from a Catholic perspective and compare and contrast these with the views of other Christian denominations and world religions.

Students receive 4 x 75 minute lessons per fortnight.

Themes covered include:

- Issues of expressing one's faith.
- Issues of law and order in religion and society.
