

Congratulations to Miss Wale

Since January, Miss Wale, a member of Cardinal Wiseman's Science Faculty, has been one of only 150 teachers in the UK accepted on to the pilot for the Chartered Teacher Programme and has recently successfully completed Phase 1.

The programme has been developed by the newly established Chartered College of Teaching and "will recognise the knowledge, skills and behaviours of excellent teachers".

The programme includes a range of different assessments to test applicants' skills and knowledge against those set out in the Chartered College's Professional Principles. Areas include deep subject knowledge, understanding of pedagogy and assessment, excellent classroom practice, as well as critical evaluation, engagement with research evidence and a desire to contribute to the profession.

Dame Alison Peacock, Chief Executive of the Chartered College of Teaching, explained: "Those achieving Chartered Teacher Status will be recognised for evidence-informed, high quality teaching practice, benefiting the young people we teach while raising the status of teachers and their important role in education and society".

The school would like to congratulate Miss Wale and show our appreciation for the strength we gain having staff like her supporting the development of teaching and learning across the academy.
