We would like to extend a very warm welcome back to all of our families and wish you all a Happy New Year! Last Sunday, 6th January, marked the celebration of the feast of the Epiphany. The Epiphany is celebrated each year and is dedicated to the revelation to mankind that Jesus Christ was the Son of God. The word 'epiphany' means an appearance or manifestation but directly translates from the ancient Greek to mean "reveal" or "revelation". Christ revealed himself in the form of a new born babe to the world and the first to recognise this and pay homage to him were of course the Magi or Wise Men as they are known.

The Gospel of St Matthew describes three Wise Men named Melchior, Caspar and Balthazar, who were told of Christ's birth and set off, following the Star of Bethlehem, to meet the baby Jesus. Across the world, the Epiphany is celebrated in different ways. In Spain, children believe their Christmas presents are delivered by the Three Wise Men on January 6, while in Venice, children believe "La Befana," an imaginary old woman in Italian folklore, brings gifts to them on the Epiphany Day.

As we start our new term, we ask for the same guidance and wisdom shown by the Magi as we continue our journey in both faith and education.

Revision tips will be posted on the Year 11 notice board (outside Mrs Morris' office) every week.

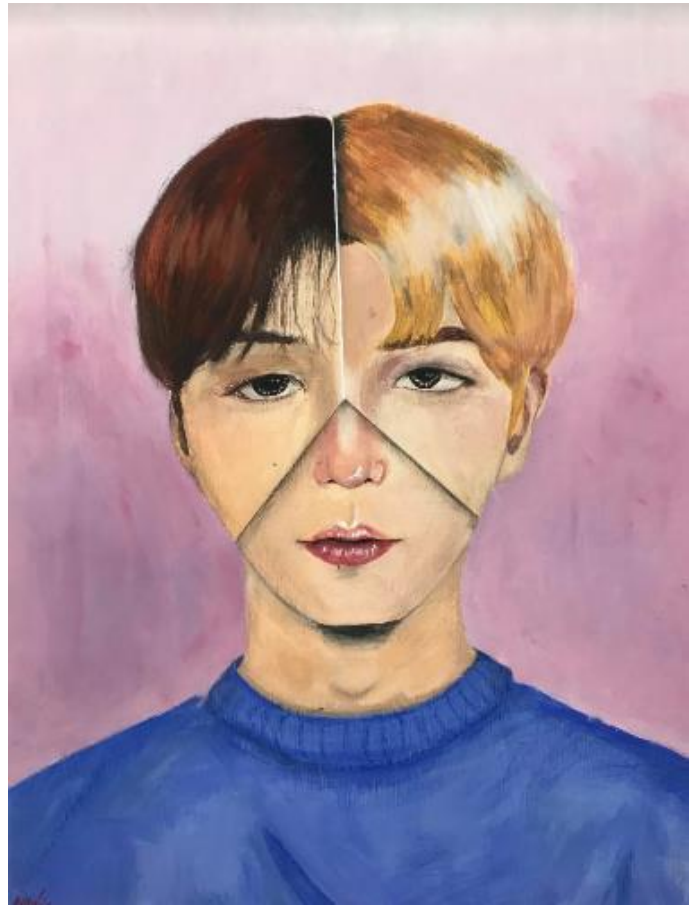
The next round of mock exams begin on Monday 11 February.
