## LEADERSHIP UPDATE


Over the past two years Cardinal Wiseman Catholic School has undergone a programme of rapid change and improvement under the leadership team established in September 2017. It has been very pleasing to see this work recognised from a range of external sources, including the Local Authority, Ofsted and most recently the school being graded 'Good' in every category in our recent inspection under Section 48. Part of this journey of improvement has been substantial investment and development of staff (both existing and new) to ensure that we can provide the highest standard of education for all of our children.

It is therefore a pleasure to announce, that the Diocese have approached us to release Mrs Morris in a secondment as Interim Head Teacher at a partner Diocesan school in Birmingham. This is fantastic news for Mrs Morris. It is recognition of her skill and expertise in senior leadership teams at Cardinal Wiseman which will stand her in good stead as she takes up this post at our partner Diocesan school. This is also great cause for celebration as it is the first time in over 16 years that a member of staff from the school has been promoted to a headship post.

Mrs Morris' success in turn, provides further opportunities for us to talent spot and bring leaders through the leadership structure and secondments that will go into place at Cardinal Wiseman in the coming weeks. This will have to be done quite quickly, as Mrs Morris will be taking up post from February half-term but will continue to teach her current teaching groups at Cardinal Wiseman until the end of the year.

I know that I speak for us all, as we thank Mrs Morris for all the significant work she has done for both the school and the wider Cardinal Wiseman community. It is a testimony to this that she is now giving back to the system by taking on this new role.
