


Dear Parent and Carers

Please be advised that from Tuesday 6 September 2022 there will be a small price increase to the cost of the main school meal. The current price is £2.35 for a meal from the Meal Deal menu. This will increase to £2.50.

The school has deliberately not implemented a price rise for the last 2 years. However, due to a change in funding from the Department of Education, as well as huge increases in the cost of wholesale food, we cannot avoid this price increase any longer. For our students in receipt of Free School Meals, the increase will be applied to the daily allowance and will ensure they continue to get a meal.

What is Arbor?

Arbor is a management information system (MIS) that helps schools collect, store, manage and use all the information they need. Arbor is a simple, smart and cloud-based MIS, which means you can log into Arbor to see and update your child's information or make payments and bookings yourself!

How can parents use Arbor?

Here's how you can use Arbor:


- Log into Parent Portal for Google Chrome on computers or laptops
- Download the Arbor App from the App Store or Google Play
- Log in on your phone
- Your school can then send you In-app messages.

Introducing Arbor Pay

From September, parents and carers will also be able to use the Arbor Pay feature on the app. This will mean that the Arbor Parent Portal will become the central hub for communications and student accounts amongst our school community. More importantly, Arbor Pay will allow users to top up accounts for students to purchase meals in the canteen, as well as pay for trips and events throughout the year.

As of Friday 22 July, Parent Mail accounts will no longer be accessible, and our Operations Team will be working together to transfer all balances over from Parent Mail to Arbor. This means that any funds currently showing within individual Parent Mail accounts will be reflected in the Arbor app by Monday 5 September 2022.

It is vital that parent and carers take time over the summer to download and familiarise themselves with the Arbor Parent Portal.

A CELEBRATION OF ART, DANCE, DRAMA, MUSIC & PHOTOGRAPHY



BRITISH BAKE OFF - JOHN BERNARD



Farewell Paddy

As we approach the Summer, we will be saying goodbye to Patrick Taggart who is retiring from his post as Director of Operations. Patrick began his vocation as a governor at Sacred Heart Catholic Primary School; from his appointment in July 1995 and then Chair for several years until he stepped down in 2006.



Anyone who knows Patrick will speak of his unequivocal passion for the promotion of Catholic Education from Primary to Secondary. With

the announcement of conversion for all eight schools Patrick took the opportunity and volunteered his services as a Governor again in February 2014, taking up post as Chair of the Board leading us through the conversion process in August 2015.

In August 2016, Patrick took up post as Academy Business Director. Through this role Patrick was instrumental in shaping a central team that would ensure Principals could focus on teaching and learning, whilst the HR/ Finance function was effectively covered through specialised teams who can rise to the challenge of compliance from the Academy Trust Handbook.

Using his extensive experience from commercial roles, HR expertise alongside his understanding of

education, he was able to establish an effective Shared Services Team, one that is highly functioning as an operation today.

Patrick has been visionary in working with Principals to create a school that brings out the best of pupils and provides an enrichment opportunity for the whole character of a child to flourish. Two examples of this, are the newly refurbished Saint Charles Lwanga Theatre at Cardinal Wiseman and the 3G Muga Pitch at Corpus Christi.

Patrick has been instrumental in establishing a state-of-the-art theatre at the Secondary school which is open and accessible to the pupils at Primary; this promotes and strengthens the transition from Primary and Secondary as well as putting the arts at the heart of our experience for all pupils.

The 3G Muga pitch has enabled sport to flourish at Corpus Christi and across schools, as well as enabling a link to our community and partnerships beyond our schools for the benefit of Coventry children.

Both aspects show demonstrable

evidence of how Patrick works with schools with a vision, to translate into a reality that greatly benefits the pupils and staff in the Romero and beyond to the city.

Patrick is always one step ahead. His contribution to Catholic Education is demonstrated in the way he goes 'above and beyond'; he is driven by making a difference for all the pupils and staff within Romero. He is innovative and forward-thinking, always looking for ways for the organisation to live out its mission; and it was under his leadership that this newsletter is bought to you. We promise to keep up his good work.

Farewell Mrs Dubby

I am one of six children and although four of us are teachers, becoming a teacher was something of an accident. After I graduated, Phil my partner still had year to go at Lancaster, so I decided to study for my PGCE at St Marys Twickenham, just in case it the qualification might come in handy one day... and it did.

First it took us to Sudan where we lived close to the banks of the Nile and we swam on Fridays. I taught English to girls who were hopeful that they might one day win a coveted place at the University of Khartoum. I then taught in South Sudan at one point, teaching classes of over 100 students. Teaching then took us to Zimbabwe - it had been six years since independence and in the five years I worked at Kwekwe High School, I really learnt how to teach economics to bright and determined students who had a drive to excel in a newly independent nation. Teaching in both Sudan and Zimbabwe really made me appreciate the value of education. I was inspired by the drive that the students had to take full advantage of any opportunities they had to progress their education.


I then came back to my home town of Coventry and joined Cardinal Wiseman. One of the joys of working at Cardinal Wiseman for so long is seeing how things change but also how much stays the same. When I started teaching here in 1993 there was group of bright older teachers including Dr Barwell, Mr Rutherford and Mr Adams, who became great friends . The friendship of colleagues has always meant that each day, I have been happy to come go to work.

The current diversity of our school community is something of which I am really proud. I was particularly delighted when Mrs Sigauke joined the staff almost 19 years after I began teaching with her in Kwekwe High School Zimbabwe. I have particularly enjoyed seeing people leave as students and return as colleagues and also seeing people grow their careers over the years. One of the first students I taught here was Mrs Burtonwood and it has been a real pleasure watching her forge ahead in her career. Not many people have had a former student become their boss, but it has always worked for us. I worked with Mrs Hirons through her training year, she hasn't changed, totally dedicated to doing her best for students in her own special ways.

I taught Miss Wale's sister and brother. She was also my twin boys favourite science teacher at Coundon Court. Mrs Alton was my next door neighbour when she was an NQT and I looked after some of her lovely students. I supported Miss Lindsay with her personal statement and was impressed with her drive and determination to achieve her goal of studying at university. I taught Mr Bench and though he wasn't too adept with the calculations required, he stuck with it and went on to achieve a Grade A. As well as teaching Economics, over the years I have been drafted in to teach Year 13 Business with the help of Mrs Hirons, A-level Law and in the last couple of years, Psychology. The latter of which would never have been possible without Mrs Campbell's support and brilliant planning. I have worked with a number of principals and I really appreciated the hard work and dedication to the students shown by Mr Everett. Mr Kingshott is my unsung hero, he has been a wonderful line manager. I don't think I have worked with anyone who works so hard and is so efficient. Mrs Brown has always been so supportive of my role in the sixth form.

One thing which has been a constant is my love of teaching my subject and through this watching students grow up and go out and find their place in the world. I have taught a number of brilliant students who have gone on to study economics at Oxford and Cambridge University. This is also a credit to Mr Wheat and his maths department. I have always tried to be the kind of teacher who I would want to teach my own children and in doing so I have loved my job here. I am now ready and looking forward to transitioning in my case to a more flexible way of working. This will allow Phil and I to travel more extensively and hopefully more comfortably than we did when we were in our twenties. I am thankful for the support and companionship of so many teachers and support staff over the years. Lastly I must mention my treasured friends in AQ10, who have made me laugh so much in the past few years. I have had such fun and will always treasure these memories.
